Tips for Summer Garden Maintenance

Programs and Support for Managing School Gardens During the Summer

1. **Farm to Cafeteria Canada: School Garden Programs**

Many *Farm to Cafeteria Canada* programs include guidance for sustainable garden management, with options for involving local community members during the summer months.

2. **Green Thumbs Growing Kids**

Based in Toronto, this program provides support for school and community gardens, often engaging volunteers or seasonal staff to maintain gardens over the summer.

3. **Evergreen Climate Ready Schools**

Offers guidance on engaging community partners, such as parents, local businesses, or summer camps, to help care for school gardens during vacations.

4. **Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) Partnerships**

Schools can partner with local CSA programs or urban agriculture organizations to co-manage gardens, with produce shared between the school and the community.

5. **Local Master Gardener Associations**

Master Gardener programs across Canada often have volunteers willing to care for school gardens as part of their community service initiatives. Simply search “master gardener + your province/town” to find support near you!

6. **Volunteer Coordination via School Boards**

Some school boards have volunteer networks or summer school programs where students or staff manage gardens during the summer.



General Tips for Maintenance

Summer Garden Committee

Form a group of parents, staff, or community members before summer begins to rotate garden duties.

Partner with Local Organizations

Collaborate with community groups or local farms for shared care.

Student Engagement

Involve students through summer camps or after-school programs focused on gardening.

Automated Systems

Install automated irrigation systems to reduce maintenance needs during summer breaks.

Customized Local Solutions

Some municipalities or school boards may have unique programs tailored to their region. It's worth checking with local conservation authorities, parks departments, or community centers for additional support!
